They are abstract, have multiple meanings, are a part of a word family, or are likely to appear again in future texts.</i>	Tell: <i>Words you just tell students are concrete words that students cannot get the meaning from context, so the meaning needs to be provided.</i>	Not Address – Students Can Use Context to Determine Meaning: <i>Words you do not address are words that are concrete, or describe an object/event/process/characteristic that is familiar to students. They can also get the meaning of these words from context.</i>
